The Importance of Hearing Your Child Read

As we support our children to learn to read, we often prioritise the early milestones, such as learning to decode (sound out) words and learn words by sight. These moments are undoubtedly important but we want to emphasise the ongoing significance of hearing your child read throughout primary school.

Reading is not merely a skill to be acquired in the early years; it is a fundamental aspect of lifelong learning. Research consistently demonstrates that children who read regularly not only perform better academically but also develop stronger cognitive abilities, improved concentration, and enhanced empathy.

Midway through primary school, the focus often shifts from learning to read to reading to learn. This transition is crucial as it marks the point where children begin to use reading as a tool to explore new concepts, expand their knowledge and develop critical thinking skills. If you have any questions leading up to SATs week, please don't hesitate to reach out to us.



TEMPORARY ROAD CLOSURE

Dear Sir or Madam,

Please be aware that Oakway Ltd have been instructed to work on behalf of **Wildanet** at the following locations:

Cardinham, Millpool, Mount, & Immediate surrounding area.

UNDERTAKING THE FOLLOWING WORKS:

EXCAVATIONS IN THE CARRIAGEWAY AND FOOTWAY TO INSTALL UNDERGROUND DUCT AND NETWORK FOR HIGH-SPEED FIBRE BROADBAND SERVICES.

Due to the width of the roads and for the safety of the general public, as well as our operatives carrying out the work, it will be necessary for temporary road closures to be put in place. We will endeavor, as much as possible, to reduce the impact on the area and local residents.

The works will take place from 07/05/2024 to 02/08/20/22.

There will be restricted access for vehicles while our operatives undertake these works. Access to properties will be maintained throughout. We will look to reopen the road when our operatives are not on site, where possible. There may be times where we have open excavations in the carriageway meaning the road will need to remain closed overnight. Please speak with the foreman on site during these works if you have any concerns.

Please be advised that signs detailing the diversion route will be in place for the duration of each road closure. We have also enclosed an overview map of the works area, highlighted in red.
